Email Phishing Red Flags

MidSouth Bank



- This is an unexpected or unusual email with embedded hyperlinks or attachments from someone I don't know or haven't communicated with recently.
- · I don't know the sender.
- I don't have a relationship nor past communications with the sender.
- Is the sender's email address from a suspicious domain, like cityofdothan@dothan.om (instead of .com)?



- I received an email with a subject line that does not match the content, or that is out of the ordinary.
- The email is in response to **something I never sent** and that **I'm not expecting.**

Proceed with Caution



- I was cc'd on an email sent to one or more people, but I don't personally know the other people it was sent to.
- I received an email sent to an unusual mix of people, for example a seemingly random group of people I know and others I don't know.
- I received an email that is **out of the ordinary** from a friend, a co-worker or someone else I **don't normally communicate with.**



I received an email outside of the hours
I normally keep, for example the email
was sent at an unusual time like 3 a.m.



 The sender included an attachment that I was not expecting or that makes no sense in relation to the email message.



- I hover my mouse over the link that's displayed in the email, but the link is to a different website.
- I received an email that **only has a link** but no additional information in the email.
- I received an email with a link that is a misspelling of a known website, for example www.cityofdothanrnaps.com, where the "m" is spelled with an "r and n".

Content:

- I received an email that has bad grammar or spelling errors.
- The sender is asking me to click on a link or to open an attachment.
- I get an uncomfortable gut feeling about the email or the sender's request to click on a link or to open the attachment.
